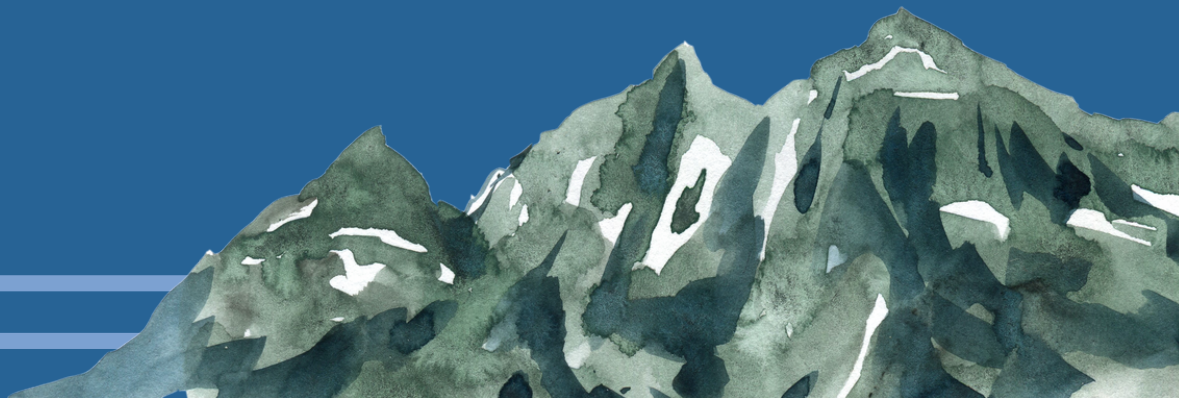

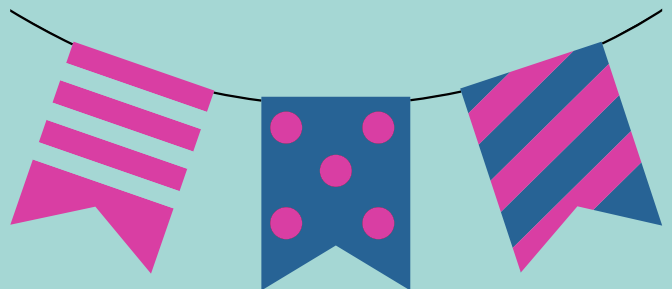

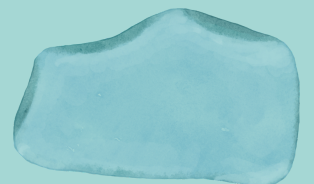
KINDNESS ROCKS

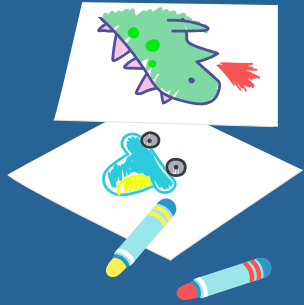
GENKI ALA WAI PROJECT

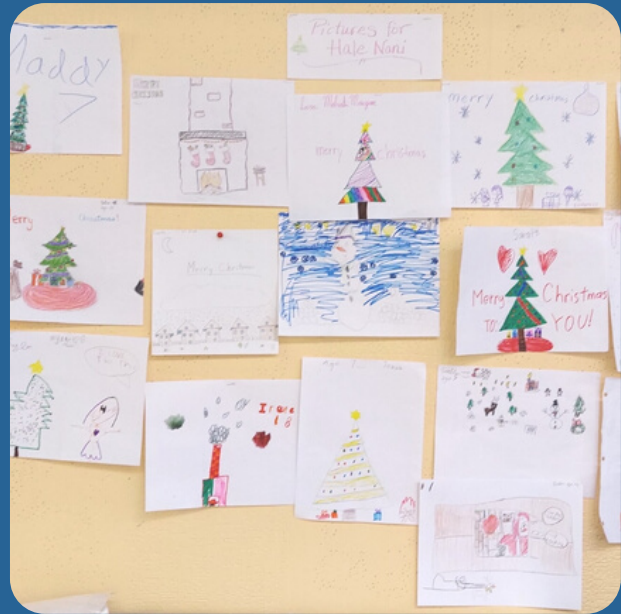


HOLIDAY PICTURES FOR PATIENTS AT HALE NANI

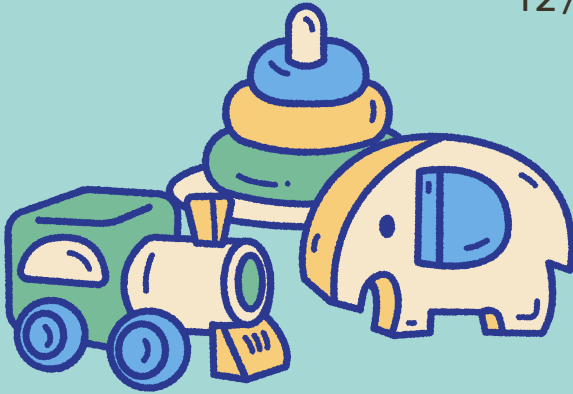


TOY DRIVE FOR FRIENDS OF THE CHILDREN'S JUSTICE CENTER OF O'AHU
