





Section 4: COVID-19 Monitoring & Communication

On a regular basis, MCS will inform families and staff about the health and safety status of our campus according to the following scheme:

Status	Hawaii/Oahu Community	MCS On-Campus Community
<p>Status Green</p> 	<p>-Rate of uncontrolled COVID-19 infection is low -Government permits essential services, including schools, to be open</p>	<p>-Campus is open to all students -No known cases of COVID-19 amongst students, families, or staff at MCS -Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff -Students remain in classroom cohorts</p>
<p>Status Yellow</p> 	<p>-Rate of COVID-19 infection is rising creating a heightened level of concern -Government permits essential services, including schools, to remain open -Some additional emergency orders are issued or under consideration for citizens/businesses being considered by State, County, or Federal governmental bodies</p>	<p>-Campus is open to all students -Possible case/s of COVID-19 amongst students, families, or staff, yet <u>to be confirmed</u> -Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff -All students who are permitted to attend in-person instruction remain in classroom cohorts</p>
<p>Status Orange</p> 	<p>-Rate of COVID-19 infection continues to grow -Hawaii State Government issues new and more limiting recommendations for essential services including schools</p>	<p>-Some parts of the campus are closed due to diagnosis of or exposure to COVID-19 by a student, staff member, or parent, or by state government mandate -Distance learning is offered to select classrooms based on potential exposure -Some classroom cohorts continue in-person learning on campus -All students allowed to attend in-person instruction remain in classroom cohorts -Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff</p>



<p>Status Red</p> 	<p><i>-Rate of COVID-19 infection is high</i> <i>-Hawaii State Government issues new and severely limiting recommendations for essential services including schools</i> <i>-Hawaii Department of Health, Governor, or Mayor has issued additional stay-at-home orders</i></p>	<p><i><u>-The campus is closed to students and teaching staff</u></i> <i>-Distance learning is practiced for all classrooms</i></p>
